#### 2023 SPECIALTY CROP BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

On August 18th, the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) announced the opening of the 2023 Specialty Crop Block Grant Program! CDFA anticipates that up to \$22 million will be awarded to projects enhancing the competitiveness of California specialty crops. Grant amounts range from \$100,000 to \$500,000. CBC staff staff submitted a concept proposal to CDFA on September 16th. The project is titled, *Temperature inducible pgSIT for Drosophila suzukii Control for California Blueberries,* with a total funding request of \$362,307. #### FINAL SEASON UPDATE WITH BMRIC

The CBC has received the preliminary final numbers for the 2022 California Blueberry Crop. It is important to note that these numbers are not yet finalized and are subject to change, however, we do not anticipate significant changes at this point. For the 2022 California blueberry season, the BMRIC system is reporting a total of 55,479,294 lbs. The original CBC estimate for the 2022 season, established in April 2022, was set at 75,000,000 lbs. There were a total of 10,612,481 lbs. processed and 44,866,813 lbs. total fresh. Of the 44,866,813 lbs. total fresh, organic production was reported at 17,611,282 lbs., representing 39% of the total fresh volume. The CBC will provide updated numbers once the BMRIC reports are finalized for the season. If you would like additional information on 2022 season pricing, please log in to the BMRIC system. #### **RESERACH PRIORITIES**

The CBC's research priorities were decided by the Research Subcommittee in July. Request for Proposals were distributed to California and out-of-state universities, California Farm Advisors, and private research companies. Proposals were due to the CBC by September 1st for the Research Subcommittee to review. The CBC Board of Directors will approve projects for funding at the annual September Board meeting.

2022-2023 research priorities: -Mechanical Harvesting for fresh blueberries -Packing house automation techniques -Mechanical pruning -Management of Spotted Wing Drosophila (SWD) -GPS Blueberry Acreage Mapping -Irradiation of Blueberries -Low-cost UAV Based System for Bird Control -Frost detection/prevention technology -Postharvest treatments/alternatives to methyl bromide fumigation -Increase shelf life/quality preservation -Alternate packaging options instead of single use plastic in response to CA state laws -Any other topic related to cost reduction/increasing the effectiveness of California blueberry production.

#### JULY LEGISLATIVE VISITS

In July, CBC staff traveled to Washington D.C., to advocate on behalf of the California blueberry industry in preparation for the reauthorization of the 2023 Farm Bill. CBC staff met with over twenty different Congressional offices in both the House and Senate.
