CA BLUEBERRY SEASON BEGINS

The California blueberry season has officially kicked off and looks promising. This year's crop is expected to be significantly larger than 2018's, in part due to the 25% crop loss seen last year, and it's expected to be 10-15% larger in volume than average. Additionally, organic blueberries are expected to significantly increase its volume compared to 2018. As a result of California's recent cooler weather, the blueberry harvest is delayed about 7 to 10 days. The California blueberry industry is looking forward to seeing a positive and strong blueberry season this year.

ANTAD TRADESHOW

From March 4-8, 2019, representatives the Commission traveled to Guadalajara, Mexico to conduct market visits, meet with key retailers, importers, and distributors, and attend the annual Expo ANTAD. This year's event featured over 25,000 visitors and nearly 2,300 exhibitors. The event is aimed at the retail sector and features opportunities for the entire food industry. The Commission participated in meetings to establish new relationships and explore new business opportunities for the California blueberry industry, and had the opportunity to speak with USDA Undersecretary of Agriculture for Trade and Foreign Agriculture Affairs, Ted McKinney. North American Blueberry Council and the United States Highbush Blueberry Council conducted their spring meeting on March 6 through March 8, 2019, in San Diego, CA. The NABC and the USHBC held meetings for their respective committees, discussing current topics and updates. Industry members from around the country had the chance to meet and discuss the blueberry industry at the semiannual meeting. CBC VISITS TOKYO, JAPAN

Todd Sanders, Executive Director, and Elizabeth Carranza, Director of Trade, traveled to Tokyo, Japan from March 31-April 5, 2019 on behalf of the California Blueberry Commission and in a joint effort with the California Olive Committee. During this visit, the CBC worked in conjunction with in-country representative, Yamano and Associates. The CBC and Yamano and Associates met with retailers, importers, and distributors in the Japanese market in an effort to increase exports to Japan. The CBC hopes to accomplish this by sparking trade interest and demand for California blueberries, expanding Japanese retail olive distribution, and securing new trade contacts. CBC PARTICIPATES IN CHINA MARKET ACCESS VISIT

In April, Chinese delegates visited the Central Valley in California as part of the U.S. efforts to negotiate market access for fresh blueberries to China. The CBC worked with officials from the CA Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA), Tulare and Kern County, U.S. Department of Agriculture Animal Plant Health Inspection Services (USDA-APHIS), the U.S. Highbush Blueberry Council, and Bryant-Christic, Inc. to facilitate the site visits. The Chinese delegation provided positive feedback following their visit to California. The Commission will continue to keep the industry updated in any developments on market access negotiations with China. Blueberry Bites Blueberry Lemon Yogurt Parfait
